School Holidays	JC issued the PC the proposed holiday schedule for 2019/20. There were some concerns re	
ochool Holldays	the timing of the Easter holiday and the start of the SQA exam diet. JC informed the PC that	
	the school will still be running an Easter study programme.

Leavers Hoodies	FW has located a company who will produce hoodies for £15 or £18 (size dependent). The PC	PC
New School Re-	will continue to gauge interest in leavers hoodies.  Following pupil and parental focus groups the colours of the school will remain as red and	
branding	black. A group of S4 pupils is looking at designing a new school badge and are working with	
branding	the architects. Again, following consultation it has been decided that all pupils from S1 will	
	wear blazers. The PC generally agree with this. JC informed the PC that every pupil in the	
	new school will have a locker. The pupil groups still want to keep the 3 ties: there will be one	
	for S1-S3, one for S4-S5 and one for S6. JC would like to buy every pupil a new tie for starting	
	in the new school building. SF agreed to find out how much is in the PC account and how we	
	access these funds and how much ties cost from the supplier. RL asked if the school had	SF
	considered the use of clip-on ties JC also agreed to investigate this option. JC will find out how	JC
	big the new lockers are. AW will start an email discussion to explore fundraising opportunities.	AW

	<u>East Calder Buses</u> : the PC will put in a complaint about the condition of the buses from East Calder.

	public transport. Holding study classes in cluster primaries was discussed as was providing	
	transport during the holidays. This will be discussed further.
